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School Uniform

All children should wear a uniform as it fosters a feeling of `belonging` to the school. It also helps children understand how to dress appropriately, i.e. "these are my working clothes." We want children to feel proud to be part of Cowling School and to be part of its uniqueness, just as they wear clothing appropriate to other organisations i.e. Brownies, Cubs, their village football team, they have clothing appropriate to school. Many parents appreciate the removal of extremes of fashion and the daily round of disagreements over what to wear. Co-operation is sought from all parents in this matter.

Cowling School Uniform is any of the following:

Navy blue/grey/black skirt, trousers;
white polo shirt or blouse;
navy blue sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper;
navy blue/white striped or check dress/pinafore,
pumps, plain navy blue or black shorts and plain white T shirt for PE, tracksuit bottoms, fleece/tracksuit top and trainers.
(optional Cowling Hooded Sweatshirt for PE).

Jeans, football shirts, Bermuda shorts, trainers and other such casual clothing should not be worn.

For safety reasons children should wear black shoes that are as flat as possible.

Jewellery and earrings

Jewellery should not be worn at school at any time. Children with pierced ears should wear studs only and these **must** be removed or taped over for all PE sessions. To help staff, it would be much appreciated if on PE days children did not come to school in earrings. When children are swimming earrings must be removed.

Children are required to change for PE.

All items should be clearly labelled with the child's name and PE kit should be kept in a PE bag which is brought to school at the start of each week.
