



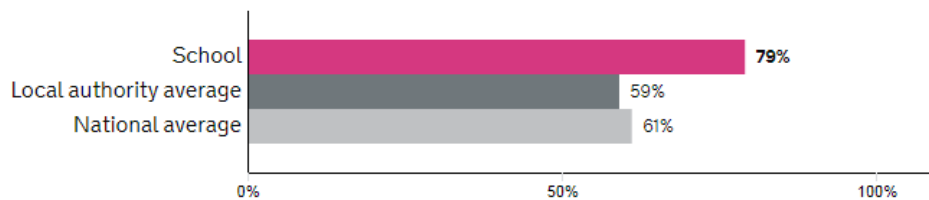
## School Performance Information 2017

### Reading, writing and maths combined

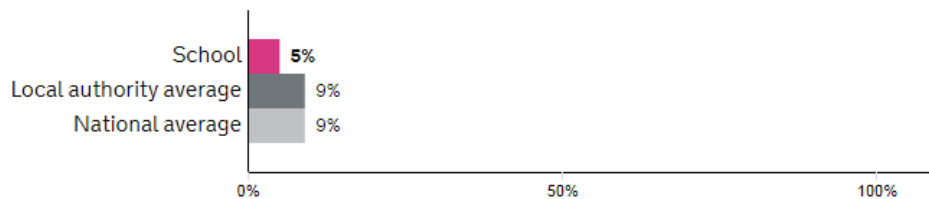
#### Percentage of pupils achieving the expected standard ?

#### Percentage of pupils achieving the higher standard ?

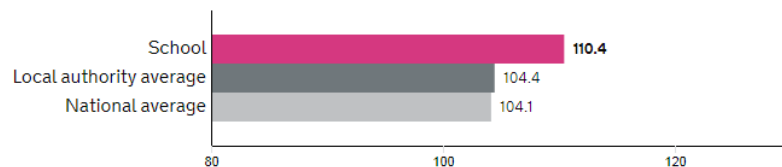

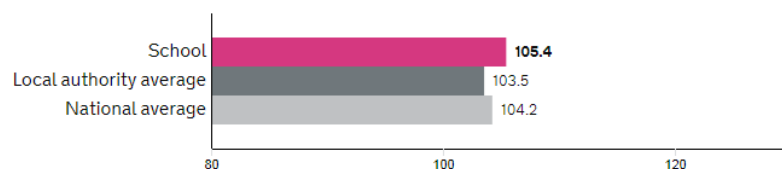
